- HLTAID007 Provide advanced resuscitation
- HLTAID008 Manage first aid services and resources

Application and Relevance

This skill set comprises three units and contains the knowledge and skills to establish, maintain and facilitate the provision of appropriate first aid in a workplace environment, including the skills to provide an emergency first aid response in the event of an emergency. It is relevant for personnel who are the designated first aiders, particularly those working in manufacturing, construction, mining or any occupation involving hazardous work.

Duration

3 days (21 hours) classroom/workplace training and assessment OR
2 days (14 hours) classroom/workplace training and assessment with workbook
theory learning completed prior.

Course Content

This course covers the provision and management of first aid resources, advanced first aid response, life support, management of casualty(s), the incident and other first aiders, until the arrival of medical or other assistance. Topics include:

- + Legislative requirements of an Occupational First Aider
- + Maintaining correct WorkCover documentation
- + Managing a First Aid Centre
- + Advanced airway management
- + Administering Oxygen Therapy and Resuscitation
- + CPR and safe use of a defibrillator (AED)
- + Infection control procedures
- + Bleeding, fractures, burns, crush injury and other trauma
- + Toxicological hazards and Material Safety Data Sheets
- + Envenomation and poisoning
- + Heart conditions, stroke, diabetes, asthma, anaphylaxis
- + Hyperthermia and hypothermia
- + Triage of multiple casualties
- + Evaluation of response to critical incidents



Prerequisites

There are no prerequisite units, however it is recommended that participants have some prior experience of providing first aid and have previously attained HLTAID003 Provide first aid. It is recommended that participants have language and literacy skills equivalent to level 3 of the Australian Core Skills Framework (ACSF). They should also have the ability to meet the considerable physical demands of the practical skills.

Assessment Methods

Progressive assessment throughout the course, including demonstration of practical skills and written and oral questions relating to underpinning knowledge. Note that the provision of CPR must be demonstrated on the floor.

Award Issued

A nationally-recognised Statement of Attainment will be issued to all successful participants.
